Luke 23:35-43

Reflections

In Sunday's Gospel for the Solemnity of Christ the King, we see Jesus on the cross, facing mockery from leaders, soldiers, and even one of the criminals beside Him. Yet Jesus never responds with anger or force. Instead, He remains a gentle and forgiving King. The other criminal recognises Jesus' goodness and simply asks, "Jesus, remember me." Jesus answers with compassion, promising him paradise. This passage reminds us that Christ's kingship is not about power or control, but about mercy, hope, and the courage to love even in difficult moments. As we finish the Church's year, we are invited to trust in this hopeful, compassionate King and to reflect His kindness in our daily lives.

We are Occupational Therapy students - Nadine, Sarah and Nicole and we recently had the opportunity to complete our final year 10-week Occupational Therapy placement at St. Bernadette's primary school. During this time, we worked closely with the school staff to provide Occupational Therapy support to pupils in school.

Occupational Therapists, help people of all ages overcome barriers and challenges in everyday tasks (occupations) so they can live life to the fullest. Our goal as Occupational Therapy students in this role, was to work under supervision to help children develop skills for everyday life, such as self-care, schoolwork, and social interaction/play, so they can participate fully in activities at school.

Throughout our placement we delivered universal and targeted support within the school environment. This included group interventions to develop fine and gross motor skills, enhance sensory regulation, and ultimately improve children's engagement and participation in key school-based activities.

As our placement approaches the end, we wanted to share some key Occupational Therapy contact information. Spotlight on Mrs Taylor, School SENCo.

- I. Can you tell us a bit about your role as SENCo and what a typical day looks like for you?

 My role is to ensure that all children with additional needs receive the right support to help them thrive in school. A typical day can be very varied meeting with parents, working with external agencies, reviewing progress, supporting children.
- 2. What do you en joy most about your job?

I enjoy seeing the children make progress and being able to celebrate that progress; I love seeing them grow in confidence. I enjoy working with families and being able to support them find practical ways to remove barriers to learning. Every day is different and it is a privilege to be part of a team that is so focused on making a positive difference for our children.

- 3. For parents who might not know, what does a SENCo actually do?

 A SENCo coordinates all the support for pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). This includes identifying needs, ensuring children get the right help in school, writing and reviewing support plans, working with teachers to adapt teaching approaches and liaising with external specialists. The SENCo also supports parents through the SEND process, offering advice, updates and guidance at every stage. Essentially, the SENCo makes sure that children with additional needs are fully included and able to achieve their best.
- 4. What kind of support might a child or family receive through the SEN team?

We have offered lots of support through external agencies this year and will continue to offer meet the agencies events as well as tailored events to specific needs.

The SEN (Special Educational Needs) team provides a wide range of support to help children with additional needs reach their full potential. This support can include:

- Targeted in-school interventions
- Specialist advice and assessments
- Individual learning plans setting out specific targets and strategies tailored to the child's needs.
- Support for parents and carers regular communication, advice on supporting learning at home, and help understanding SEND processes or referrals.
- Coordination with external agencies
- Training and guidance for staff to help teachers and teaching assistants adapt classroom practice to meet individual needs.

Overall, the SEN team works closely with children, families, and staff to create an inclusive environment and ensure each child receives the right support at the right tim

5. When should a parent get in touch with you — and how can they do that?

It's really important that the first port of call is always the class teacher, as they know your child best. We follow a graduated approach: if a class teacher has concerns, they will speak with you and put interventions in place. After a period of intervention, if either the teacher or you still have concerns, the child may be placed on the SEN register.

You should contact me after speaking with your child's class teacher. I am usually available at the start and end of the day (Monday—Thursday), but the best way to reach me is by email: sendco@stberns.bham.sch.uk

- 6. What happens after a parent contacts you with a concern about their child?

 Once you contact me, I will:
 - Speak with the class teacher and teaching assistants to gather their observations and views.
 - Schedule a meeting with you so we can work together using the graduated approach to put the right support in place.

I am here to listen and support you and your child in any way possible. Sometimes this means providing additional intervention in school, and other times I may suggest support from external agencies to ensure your child gets the help they need.

7. What's the most rewarding part of your work as SENCo?

The most rewarding part is seeing the progress children make and being able to celebrate their achievements, no matter how big or small. Watching their confidence grow and knowing we've made a positive difference in their learning journey is truly fulfilling.
