Gymnastics CPD team teaching with Mrs Curran (Positive PE)	To improve staff confidence and subject knowledge in teaching gymnastics, ensuring high-quality, progressive gymnastics teaching for all pupils.	All classes (Reception-Year 6) completed half a term of high-quality gymnastics with CPD for staff, Reception completed a full term, and SEN children received weekly 1:1 sessions. Staff (most) confidence in delivering gymnastics improved and pupils demonstrated improved skills, confidence, and enjoyment.	KI 3, KI 4	£7950
2. Dance CPD team teaching with Jade (JDC)	To upskill staff and enrich PE through creative dance while supporting curriculum performance opportunities.	All classes completed half a term of dance with Jade, with some staff gaining confidence and expertise. Pupils developed coordination, creativity, and confidence in dance. Jade also supported Y6's Jungle Book production, enhancing performance quality.	KI 3, KI 4	£2890
3. SEN reward trip to Metchley Park Gymnastics Centre	To provide inclusive, motivational experiences for SEN pupils.	SEN pupils attended a reward trip to a well-resourced gymnastics centre, boosting their confidence, enjoyment of physical activity and motivation to participate in PE.	KI 4	£150
4. Purchase of GetSet+PE planning and assessment tools	To provide consistency and progression in PE delivery and support staff confidence in planning.	In Summer 2, GetSet+PE planning was implemented (trialled) across the school, ensuring structured, high-quality PE lessons. Staff confidence in delivering progressive PE improved, and planning was aligned with the National Curriculum. Assessment systems were prepared for Insight tracking for 2025-26.	KI 3	£682.50
5. Purchase of new equipment for PE, lunch, clubs, and Sports Day	To improve the quality and safety of PE, clubs and active playtimes.	New equipment was purchased and utilised in lessons, clubs and lunchtime activities, increasing pupil participation, enjoyment and opportunities to try a variety of sports and activities. 6. Participation in football leagues, CSPP, CBSP, and inter-school fixtures	To increase opportunities for competitive sport and representing the school.	Pupils from Years 3-6 participated in football leagues, Catholic Schools Primary Partnership events, and the Central Birmingham Sports Partnership, including fixtures for SEN children. Pupils developed teamwork, resilience and sportsmanship while increasing physical activity levels.	KI 2, KI 5	£400
7. Circus Mash workshops (Y5/6) and Ballet workshops (Reception)	To enrich physical activity through creative opportunities linked to themed curriculum days.	Year 5/6 participated in circus skills workshops, and Reception took part in ballet workshops during French Day, broadening their experiences and developing balance, coordination and cultural awareness.
