

Good bye Mr Lavin

After a career spanning almost 25 years, Mr Lavin, our Deputy Head, will be leaving St Bernadette's at Christmas. As a staff, we are devastated to be losing him, as he has worked tirelessly for many years supporting the staff, children and families of St Bernadette's School. He is an exceptionally talented teacher, who has taught in both key stage 1 and key stage 2 and has been instrumental in developing the curriculum in school over the years. A mentor and friend to so many staff he has always been on hand to offer them practical advice and guidance on how they can get the very best from the children in their care.

Mr Lavin has also been my right hand man for 16 years, after he was appointed as Deputy Head in 2005. His support and loyalty has been unwavering, on both a personal and professional level and for this I thank him sincerely. His role is not an easy one to fulfil but he has never shyed away from the responsibility he holds. Every decision he has ever made has been carefully considered and made in the best interests of the children. He is one of the most hard working, conscientious members of staff I have ever had the pleasure of working with. Catholic Education and St Bernadette's School will miss him greatly.

This is a decision he has not taken lightly, as he has thought long and hard about it for some time. It is the right decision for him at this point in his life and after having some time out from school, he may return in the new academic year. The Governing Body have granted him a sabbatical leave for two terms, in the hope that he may choose to return to school in September. I will of course keep you notified of any decision he makes in the summer term.

We all wish him the very best of luck for the future and thank him for his service to education.


Person of the Fortnight

Every two weeks we will be sharing information about a range of different important figures: scientists, athletes, musicians, etc. to help increase the children's aspirations, general knowledge and cultural capital. This week that person is Evonne Goolagong.

Aged six Evonne read a magazine article about a young girl who made it to centre court at a magical place called Wimbledon. Somehow, she knew she had to get there. Fast forward 15 years and Evonne was the first Indigenous Australian to win Wimbledon, aged 20 years old. Evonne is a pioneer of Indigenous rights and women in tennis.

Advent

The Advent Wreath symbolises our waiting and expectation for Christ to come again. The candles mark the four weeks of Advent. Three of the candles are purple whilst the candle used for the third week of Advent is pink. This is used to mark Gaudete Sunday which means rejoice Sunday. The ring of evergreen is symbolic of God's everlasting love which, like a ring, has no beginning and no end. The holly leaves are a reminder of the crown of thorns Jesus wore at his crucifixion and the berries symbolise his blood. During the season of Advent, we pray for Openness to the Word of God, Migrants and Refugees and Expectant Mothers



Read-a-thon

As you are aware this half term we are holding a read-a-thon. We are trying to encourage pupils to read as many books as possible, whilst also hoping to raise money to buy new books for our school library. Christmas Holidays

Please remember that the Autumn term does not finish until Wednesday 22nd December, with the children not returning to school until Monday 10th January. These dates may be different from other Birmingham Schools.

Christmas Party Afternoon

The children will have their Christmas Party afternoon in school in Tuesday 21st December. Your child should bring their own plate of party food (clearly labelled with their name). Please note that the children will have lunch as normal on this day so do not require a vast amount of food. Due to a number of children having life threatening allergies, please ensure any food sent in to school does not contain nuts. Also, the children may wear their own party clothes to school on this date.



Inclement Weather

If there is bad weather, and in the unlikely event that school needs to close, please listen to the local radio stations. The school texting service, school website and the school Twitter feed will also be used to inform parents. If you do not receive a text by 8am, then you can assume that school will be open as normal. If a blanket closure is announced by Birmingham City Council then we will close. Please note: School will complete a risk assessment of the site while making this decision, it is up to you as parents to risk assess your journey to school to ensure the children arrive safely.

Christmas Liturgies

COVID-19

Unfortunately, we are seeing an increase in the number of people testing positive for COVID-19 in the area and therefore request that **all visitors to the school site wear a face covering to ensure the safety of the staff and pupils in school.**

If your child is feeling unwell and you are unsure as to whether to send them to school, as you may think they have Covid, please refer to the following symptoms:

- a high temperature above 37.8c– this means feeling hot to touch on the chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature)
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means not being able to smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

Please ensure that you **do not send your child to school if they have COVID-19 symptoms.**

Please ensure that as a family, you are testing twice weekly using LFD tests to limit possible transmission by people that may be asymptomatic. LFD test kits can be ordered online from <https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests>

Communication and Autism Team (CAT) – Parent Information

Who are the Communication and Autism Team?

- The Communication and Autism Team (CAT for short) is part of Access to Education who are a group of services supporting children and young people with additional needs in schools in Birmingham.
- Every mainstream school and academy has a Communication and Autism Team professional assigned to the setting.

How does the Communication and Autism Team support schools?

- We work together with schools to build their knowledge, understanding and skills to support children/young people with autism or significant social communication differences.
- We support schools through the delivery of a package of training including Autism Education Trust Training; and through a School Partnership Plan based upon the Autism Education Trust Autism Standards. <https://www.autismeducationtrust.org.uk/>
- We work with schools to ensure improved outcomes for autistic children and young people throughout their school.

How does the Communication and Autism Team support individual children/young people?

- We work in partnership with the school to embed good autism practice within the school community.
- We may look at your child's access to their classroom environment; their relationships with teachers and peers; their communication skills; their access to the curriculum; and sensory differences.
- We may observe and/or work one to one with pupils in school. The work we do is dependent upon the child/young person needs.
- We may use tools that we have developed such as our "All About Me" tool and our "Anxiety Tool" to gather your child/young person's view of their experience in school.
- We suggest strategies and model ways of working with children/young people to support them within their classrooms. Sometimes these do not work straight away so we will monitor with schools to help support your child/young person.
- We support the child/young person to have their say about their school experience.

How is my child registered with CAT?

- We support children and young people with a diagnosis of autism and those on the pathway towards a potential diagnosis of autism. We also support children with significant communication and interaction differences.
- The SENCo within the school or setting will ask you if you are happy for your child to be registered with our team.
- Your child will only be known to our service following receipt of your signed consent.

How do I contact my child's Communication and Autism Team professional?

- Email CATParentEnquiries@birmingham.gov.uk with your child's name and school.
- A message will be sent to your CAT professional who will contact you as soon as they are able to.



Do the Communication and Autism Team give support to parents?

CAT PAC (Parent Awareness Course):

- We have developed a 6-week course for parents/carers called CAT PAC to support understanding around autism as well as giving parents/carers a chance to talk with others.
- The course looks at different aspects of autism such as: communication and interaction; sensory differences; eating, sleeping and toileting differences; and supporting anxiety and emotional distress.
- CAT PAC courses are delivered each term and invitations are sent to SENCos to pass onto you if you are interested in attending a course.
- Courses are delivered remotely via Microsoft Teams or face to face at a school.
- CAT also run coffee mornings within schools and across the city for parents to meet up and discuss experiences.

Webinars:

- We deliver webinars and sessions around specific issues in addition to the CAT PAC. Information will be sent via your school SENCo and can be found on the Local Offer website:

Will I meet my Communication and Autism Team professional?

- Sometimes you will meet your Communication and Autism Team professional in school.
- You are the expert on your child, and it is important that we work together to support your child/young person to reach their goals.
- Sometimes contact will be via email, phone call or Microsoft Teams. We will try to keep in touch with you.
