




# A HISTORY OF ST BERNADETTE'S

# COMMUNICATION WITH PARENTS

- A fortnightly newsletter is emailed to parents on alternate Fridays which will inform you of any forthcoming events or new initiatives introduced in school.
- Any payments made to school will be via parent pay. This will include school fund, school meals and payments for school trips.
- Consent for local trips etc will be via parent pay.
- A welcome meeting is held at the beginning of the term for Nursery parents.
- All parents are encouraged to attend the Inspire workshops.
- Parental consultations are held in the Autumn and Spring term and a written report is forwarded to parents in the Summer term.
